<b>Titel of excursion</b>	Implementation of <i>Typha</i> & wet meadow paludiculture – barriers and enablers in governance and policy
<b>Max number of participants</b>	30
<b>Cost of excursion</b>	€75
<b>Time of departure from Greifswald</b>	8:00
<b>Estimated arrival back in Greifswald</b>	17:30
<b>Catering</b>	Small packed breakfast for the morning and lunch at the “Moorbauer”.
<b>Toilet facilities</b>	Toilets available at the <i>Typha</i> site and at the Moorbauer
<b>Clothing recommendation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>– Rubber boots</li><li>– Rain jacket, depending on the weather forecast</li><li>– Sturdy shoes, longer walks necessary to reach <i>Typha</i> site (1,2 km)</li></ul>
<b>Excursion description</b>	<p>Visit of two paludiculture sites in the Upper Peene Valley and exchange on hindering factors and enablers in governance and policy with invited politicians. Get to know the "Moorbauer", a riverside excursion restaurant situated in the middle of the peatland and gain insights into some local observations on rewetting peatlands.</p> <p><b>First stop:</b> Managed <i>Typha</i> paludiculture on 10 ha site with up to 5 m of peat layer, surrounded by grassland dominated by reed canary grass, partly grazed by suckler cows</p> <p><b>Second stop:</b> The fen meadows near Lake Kummerow (ca. 400 ha) have historically been drained for agricultural use and were re-wetted more than a decade ago. Nowadays the sedge-dominated peatland is partly annually mown with adapted techniques. The harvested biomass is used for producing packaging material.</p> <p><b>Third stop:</b> The “Moorbauer” is a little restaurant in the midst of peatland accessible only by pedal boat swan, used to engage in conversations with regional and local stakeholder. And it's a bit of a shaggy outsider among the region's historic places. Since the early 1960s, it has been a popular institution as one of the rare independently run pubs in the region. Today, we explore from here, how to defuse the at times muddled situations regarding peatland rewetting.</p> <p><a href="https://moorbauer.com/">https://moorbauer.com/</a></p>
